### DESCRIPTION OF SCHOOL:

El Camino Real High School, a *California Distinguished School*, is a comprehensive four-year high school in the Los Angeles Unified School District, located in the West San Fernando Valley and serving the communities of Woodland Hills, West Hills and Canoga Park. El Camino Real High also receives students under the District's Voluntary Integration Program. 3.9% of the students are ELL, English Language Learners. This highly academic campus has 36% of its seniors attending four-year institutions and 52% attending two-year or community college. 94.2% of the class of 2009 graduated with diplomas.

All students have access to Honors and AP classes. Honors are not usually offered in the summer.

Concurrent enrollment is available at local community colleges.

**METHOD OF COMPUTING ECR GRADE POINT AVERAGE.** Grades are weighted for AP courses only (not honors). A .025 per semester is added for each A, B & C. All course work is counted. A= 4, B = 3, C = 2, D = 1 F = 0. D is a passing grade for high school, however colleges require a C as a passing grade. 230 credits are required for graduation.

Primary GPAs and ranking for reporting to colleges is based on marks achieved in ALL courses in 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> grade. The E.C.R. College Office has handouts to calculate other GPAs.

**SPECIAL PROGRAMS.**

**CSF:** (California Scholarship Federation) A statewide organization to honor outstanding high school students. CSF fosters high standards of scholarship, service, and citizenship. Students must apply each semester for membership, starting at the beginning of second semester of 10<sup>th</sup> grade. To receive a life membership and a gold seal on your diploma, you must apply each semester (including senior year).

**AVID:** (Advancement Via Individual Determination) A program that offers under-represented students, academic and motivational support while preparing them for college eligibility. Students learn writing, language and collaborative problem-solving skills in college preparatory classes that fulfill college requirements.

**HUMANITAS PROGRAM:** A program designed to correlate fields of English, science, social studies, music and art. This program offers team teaching in an interdisciplinary approach for all grades 9th through 12th.

**ACADEMIC DECATHLON:** Students compete as individuals and team members in a series of ten academic events and could go on to state and national competition. In 1996, 1997, 1998, 2001, 2004, 2005 and 2007 El Camino Real placed FIRST in State; in 1996 and 1997 placed SECOND in the Nation; in 1998, 2001, 2004, 2005 and 2007 El Camino Real placed FIRST in the United States National Competition.
